US and LMIC Fellowships in Global Health

Announcement: August 2018

The application cycle for the 2019-2020 Global Health Equity Scholars (GHES) fellowship is now open. Applications will be accepted until **November, 2018**.

The GHES offers a global health mentored experience for postdoctoral fellows, advanced PhD and professional school students. This Fogarty funded program provides 12-month research training fellowship opportunities at partner research institutions in low and middle-income countries (LMIC).

The GHES provides a research fellowship for trainees to study health topics and challenges in global health and, in particular, urban slums. GHES fellows will spend 10 to 11 months at one of the 31 GHES LMIC collaborating sites. The research topics include HIV/STI, tuberculosis, other infectious diseases, non-communicable chronic diseases, mental health, substance abuse, air pollution, epidemiology & surveillance, violence, nutrition, healthcare systems and any topic related to health.

US postdoctoral applicants from any US institution can apply and must be citizens or permanent residents. **US predoctoral** applicants must be students at UC Berkeley, Yale, Stanford or Florida International University. **LMIC postdoctoral** applicants must conduct the research fellowship at an LMIC institution already affiliated with the GHES program.
